



Uniform Shirts:

Do you need another Uniform Shirt? We have some in stock in both long and short sleeves. We sell the uniform shirts at cost and they are \$55.

Club Casual Shirts:

We also have some of the club casual shirts in stock, - \$35 each.

Uniform Red Pants:

These can be ordered and we sell them at cost. Draw string shorts \$40, draw string long pants \$45. Tailored pants & shorts are in limited supply and are more expensive.

COVID

Just like any other club this virus has had an impact on our Club operations and our members.

If you test positive or become a "close contact" please advise the Club immediately, Phone Ian Campbell 0418566870 or Irene Giannikos 0417810029.

Please remember to scan the QR code or put your details on the sign in sheet located on the bar whenever you are at the Club. In the event of someone having been at the Club, who tests positive, we need to contact you as soon as possible.

Some clubs have introduced a no jab, no entry policy. The TWBC respects the right of people to choose not to be vaccinated, however we do ask that, when you are at the club, regardless of whether you are vaccinated or not, that you strictly adhere to the SA Govt Health guidelines, especially in relation to distancing, wearing of masks indoors and ensuring you sanitise your hands frequently.

The Club has a COVID Business Continuity Plan in place, in the event a Volunteer or Member has been at the Club within 10 days of testing positive to COVID.

The current Clubrooms capacity is capped at 20 people in the bar area and 20 in the dining room, please keep this in mind and don't add chairs to the tables.

The introduction, by Bowls SA, of the No jab, no play policy, for Pennant matches, has had a detrimental impact on our Pennant sides.

If you are in a COVID situation, check the SA Health Web site OR call the COVID hotline <u>1800 253 787</u> to get the latest rules in relation to "Close Contact" and Isolation requirements.

"CLOSE CONTACT"

At the time of writing this article, in South Australia a 'close contact' is defined as:

- a household member or intimate partner of a person with COVID-19 during their infectious period
- someone who has had close personal interaction with a person with COVID-19 during their infectious period:
 - for 15 minutes or more; and
 - where masks are not worn by the person and the COVID-19 case; and
 - in close physical proximity; and
 - $\circ \quad \text{in an indoor setting} \quad$
- someone who has been notified by SA Health that they are a close contact
- someone who has been to an <u>exposure site</u> listed on the SA Health website.

People with COVID-19 are considered infectious two days before their symptoms started or if they didn't have any noticeable symptoms, they are considered infectious two days before they had their positive COVID-19 test taken. The infectious period ends 10 days after they had their positive test taken.

<u>As a guide</u> to isolation times, as at writing this: If you test positive you need to isolate for 10 days from when you took the test. If you are a "close contact" you must get a test immediately & quarantine for 7 days if the first test is negative have a second test on day 6. A negative day 6 test is required for release from isolation.

If you cannot isolate independently from the positive case, different Isolation rules apply.
