At the Metro Bowls AGM clubs were advised that consideration is being given to running a "Masters League" competition, targeting people over 75 years of age. lt is envisaged this competition would run parallel to the Saturdav Pennant competition with only 16 ends being played and no dead ends.

The motion put to the AGM in relation to commencing Saturday matches at 12.30pm was defeated.

Bowls SA news

With the revocation of the State Emergency Declaration, Bowls SA have rescinded the "No Jab No Play" policy.

With smaller clubs, especially country clubs, finding it hard to grow Membership, Bowls SA received numerous complaints in relation to their affiliation fee.

The affiliation fee model was based on clubs being incentivised to grow their Membership by 3% each year to cover an annual increase of 3% in the Affiliation fee.

This proved unsustainable and Bowls SA canvassed the clubs to put forward their preferred model for the calculation of the fee.

The model chosen as a result of the survey was the 'sliding scale model' whereby the fee is calculated on the actual number of Full Members.

The new model comes into effect from 1st July 2022.
