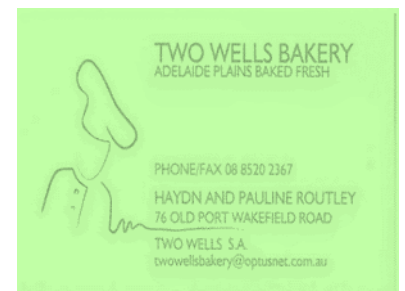

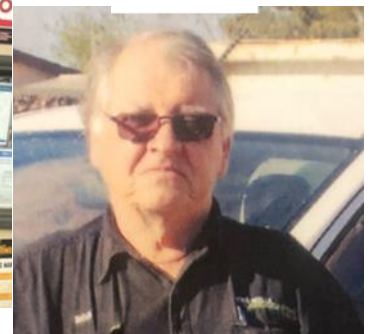

# CHANGES TO CONDITIONS OF PLAY FOR 2023-24

There is a full list of the changes on the Notice Board in the clubhouse. I have put the details (below) of the changes that most affect players on match day:

Pre-game procedures:

**Match start times have been changed:**

**Saturday: 1pm**

**Wednesday: 12.15pm**

**Thursday: 10am**

**Cards will be drawn 30 minutes before game start times.**

**Practise:**

**Greens are to be made available one hour prior to the game commencing.**

**You can practise on any rink on the green UNTIL the cards have been drawn.**

**ONCE THE CARDS ARE DRAWN**

**Side Managers must notify players and players MUST THEN ONLY PRACTICE ON THE RINK THEY ARE DRAWN TO PLAY ON.**

**Practise finishes approximately 5 minutes before the game commences.**

**There is no up and back at the start of matches.**

**Games are to be started by ringing a bell or PA announcement.**

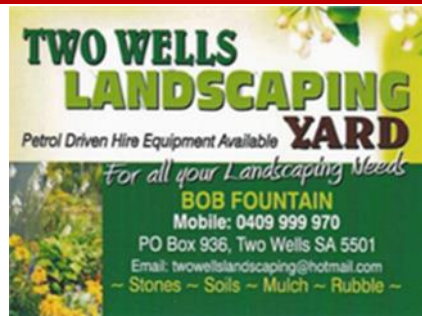
The emphasis is on "play without delay".

Most **Mid Game break times altered.**

**No "Replays" for Thursday competition.**

**Cards to be drawn 30 minutes prior to game start time.**

**Side coach must be identified prior to the start of a game.**

## ASK THE UMPIRE

Question:

Second A drives his/her bowl, misses the head, hits the face of the bank and rebounds back onto the rink and rests on the jack. Skip A claims that it is a toucher as it was still in course. Skip B objects and says the bowl is dead. Who is correct?

Answer:

Skip B is correct. Law 17.1.2 A bowl is dead if it is not a toucher and rebounds onto the rink after contact with the face of the bank or with the jack or a toucher in the ditch.

Question:

A Jack rebounds from the face of the bank as a result of a drive. Is the Jack still alive?

Answer:

Law 21.1 The end will continue when a jack is at rest on the green, it is driven against the face of the bank and rebounds onto the rink of play.

Question:

In the situation above, what distance must the jack be from the centre of the mat, measured from the mat across to the jack in its new position?

Answer:

Crystal Mark 4 law book states in the Domestic Rules section that this measurement, in Australia, is 18 metres. DR 1.3 & Law 10.5
