UMPIRES & MEASURERS

All clubs need to have Umpires.

Bowls SA run accreditation sessions for people willing to perform the role of umpire or measurer.

The club will pay the cost of the session/s and provide you with a Laws of the sport of bowls, rule book.

This is a great way to get to know the rules of the game and not rely on other person's interpretations.

If you don't think the responsibility of Umpiring is for you, you can undertake the "Measurers" course.

In fact, most match days, a Measurers skills are more frequently required than an Umpires decision or interpretation of the rules.

Question:

If an end has been started, but not completed, due to lightening or rain stoppage, can it be continued when the game recommences?

Answer:

No, the end must be declared dead. Law 32.2 If all the bowls have been played but the process of deciding the number of shots scored has not been completed prior to players leaving the green the end must be declared dead. Law 33.3





NEWS

With the changes introduced at the state of the Pennant season in relation to rollups and match start times, there were several interpretations of what was to occur.

The rollup was the topic of much debate.

Bells were ringing (or announcement being made) at various times with some people not being allowed onto the green and until half an hour before the game, others making people get off of the green for five minutes before the commencement of the game.

Metro bowls put out a Memo to clarify the rules:

Pre game Practice –

Bells: Pennant Conditions of Play indicate that a bell or P/A announcement should be used to signify the start of play (Rule 5.4). No other bells or announcements are required.

Opening of greens: Clubs are asked to remind their players that opening of greens for practice at times before the prescribed practice time (Rule 5.3.1) is solely at the discretion of the home club and is not a right (Rule 5.3.2).















"The Mid North Community Passenger Network" is a community organisation designed to help people living in the Mid North region access to medical & specialist appointments to Adelaide or with the Mid North.


We provide a service which is affordable and stress free. It is important that people living in the mid North support and use this much needed service.


