CLUB CONSTITUTION & UPDATED BY-LAWS

As discussed at the AGM in 2023 of the Board Management has been working on re-writing the Club's Constitution accordance with the amended Associations Incorporation Act (SA) 1985 and reviewing the By-Laws.

Most of the changes are combinations of clauses and the movement of clauses into different sections resulting in numbering changes. However, some other changes proposed are the office bearers, processes moved to policies and procedures or By-Laws. Also, clauses allowing flexibility to adjust to modern practises. PLAYERS MEETING SUMMARY



The Metropolitan Bowls Assoc has requested feedback from players in relation to the Pennant competition.

On the 29th February our players were invited to a meeting to voice their views on the competition.

The questions asked were:

- What do you like about the current competition?
- What don't you like about the current competition?
- What suggestions do you have to amend the current conditions of play?
- What new suggestions do you have to improve the competition?

In general, most of discussion was around the start time as amended for the 23-24 season. The feeling was that the match start time of 1pm is good however the rollup/practise time needs some work, mainly because players have their roll-up and then have to sit around waiting for 1pm, often when the temperature is hot and on the rise.

A suggestion that the rollup/practise commence at 12.30 and then, once all players have completed them

practice/roll up and are ready to play the match can begin.

Tea breaks were also brought up and for Saturday & Wednesday with resounding support that they definitely be retained as they are the catalyst for the club to sell raffle tickets and raise funds.

Aligning start times for Wednesday and Saturday was not supported.

ANZAC DAY


Entries are filling fast so give Paul a ring if you want to play. Sometimes other teams need a player so you may get a game as a fill-in if there are no vacancies for a team.

TO MAKE YOU SMILE








